A sampling of the stories includes: *A Sad Holiday Season* - In the north of England, a sixteen-year-old girl disappeared after Christmas shopping with her friend. A massive manhunt led police to a serial killer who lived just blocks away from her home. *Pretty in Pink* - A teenage girl showed up at the door of a farmhouse bruised, bloody, and unable to remember how she got there. Investigators dug through the clues to uncover a bizarre love triangle and a gruesome murder. *A Perfect Holiday* - After her partner is sent to prison for molesting her eldest daughter, a mother will do anything to keep her two youngest children from being taken by social services. *The Christmas Tree Farm Murders* - An elderly couple in southwest Washington disappeared hours before they were due to host a Christmas party at their home. It took detectives twenty-seven years to bring the killer to justice. *They Got in the Way* - A single mother of two young children would do absolutely anything to

spend more time meeting sex partners online. Even the unthinkable.
