While traditionally performed with bodyweight, incorporating a kettlebell held between the feet or ankles significantly intensifies kettlebell leg lowers. Lie on your back, holding the kettlebell securely. Keeping your legs straight, slowly lower them towards the floor, stopping just before your lower back arches. Engaging your lower abs forcefully, lift your legs back to the starting position. This exercise directly targets the lower rectus
